During the second half of the Autumn term we are learning about 'The Amazing Americas'. In Science we are learning about light. Try to read every day, even for five minutes. Share a book with family, this could be you reading to adults, adults reading to you or a mixture of the two. Write a short review or draw a picture from a book you have enjoyed.

Research global foods. Where does our food come from? We will be focusing on Mexican food and special meals Mexican families enjoy. Try making a Mexican dish.



In English we will be exploring journalistic writing and the features of a newspaper report. Can you find a newspaper report and identify the features? You could even write your own!

> Keep practising times tables and their related division facts. We will be learning about fractions, decimals and percentages. You could look at how we use fractions, decimals and percentages in real life contexts such as baking, news reports or comparing petrol prices.

Carry out some research on North and South America. You could use the internet or library books or even pay a visit to the World Museum. You could find out the names of the capital cities in North America and South America. Can you find North and South America on a world map? Can you find out about their different cultures?

Keep practising times tables and their related division facts. Carry out any separate Maths work set by Year 6 teachers. Remember how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000.

In computing we are looking at how to use Microsoft Publisher to produce leaflets, flyers and information sheets for our Christmas production. Could children start thinking of design ideas?

We are learning about light in Science. Carry out some research at home. Try researching how light travels, explore how we see, reflections and shadows and look at Isaac Newton's experiments on light and colour.
