Below are some ideas of activities that you can do at home as well as the Oak Academy work. Enjoy and let us know how you get on please. We can't wait to see you all on Tuesday 13th October.

Share a book with your family. If you have some books at home try reading one from an author who you haven't read anything by yet.

In class we are reading 'The Trouble With Perfect' by Helena Duggan. You could write a short review, a character description of Violet or Boy or a diary entry. You could draw some illustrations from the book. Don't forget to tweet or email us some pictures!

Science: If you have the materials at home you could try to make a paper cup telephone. You will need two paper cups and about 2 metres of string. Don't worry if you don't have these things. We will also make them in class in the next science lesson.

RE: Who was Jesus? Think about why people think he was such a good leader. Why is he still worshipped today? Look at some of the things he said – Sermon on the mount. Use videos from BBC Bitesize – start with - **What was Jesus like and where did he grow up?, then use **The story of Jesus' disciples, Peter and Andrew (animation)**, then **Jesus recruits disciples and shares stories.****

Spanish: Use the internet to practise your greetings. Say hello and ask members of your family how they are. Encourage different answers, e.g. muy bien, mal, regular etc.

History: Research your favourite king or queen and create a factfile or presentation about them ready to share in class next week.

Art: Draw an autumn picture looking out of one of your windows. Put plenty of autumnal colours into it.

Try to stay active and get some exercise. You could use the Joe Wicks workouts or go onto the GoNoodle website if you can. Be creative at home. Dust off the old Wii Sports or similar, if you have something like that.

Keep practising the times tables you are unsure of. Remember to practise them in order and also out of order as well as the division facts that go with them. Try to learn any little tricks to help you (like the 9s on fingers).

We are looking at online relationships in computing. Can you make an acrostic poem using the letters RESPECT? Each line needs to be a way you can show kindness and respect to others online.
