









Instructions for, how to make a wormery.

Step	Instruction	Diagram
1	Place small stones as the first layer.	
2	Add a layer of compost.	
3	Add a small amount of water so that the compost is moist but not completely wet.	
4	Health and Safety <i>Wear plastic gloves to handle the worms. Ensure that worms are handled gently.</i> Place a few worms gently onto the compost.	
5	Health and safety. <i>Wear plastic gloves while adding waste food.</i> Place a handful of scraps on top of the worms. Leave it placed gently on the worms, it will fall further by itself so there is no need to push it down.	
6	Wet the shredded paper and add the topmost layer of your mini compost bin.	

7	Add a thin piece of fabric over the top of the plastic bottle and secure it with an elastic band.	
8	Attach long rectangular pieces of card around the bottle so that it makes it dark for the worms. They live in the dark and do not like bright lights.
