## COVID 19 – Outbreak Contingency Plan January 2022

When should my child self isolate or miss school?





- All children must attend school unless they are ill.
- All children aged between 5 18. 6 years identified as a contact with someone with COVID are Strongly Advised to take a Lateral Flow test everyday for 7 days and continue to attend school unless the result is Positive.
- If Parent/carer is isolating, you should not leave your house for any reason. You should find an alternative method for your child to attend school.



o If your child develops COVID symptoms they should <u>stay at home</u> until they have received a negative test result.

NHS says main symptoms are:

- High Temperature
- o A new continuous cough
- o A loss or change of taste or smell

However reported symptoms for the Omicron variant include

- o Runny nose
- Sore throat
- o Headache

Low community Transmission. No School cases  There have been no cases of COVID within school No COVID measures are necessary beyond:

- Reminding children of good hand hygiene.
- Ensuring good ventilation encouraged where practical.
- Ensuring children/ staff stay at home if they have COVID symptoms (and to book/ take a test)

Staff will continue to test themselves using Lateral flow tests.

Measures in school will be reintroduced,

- o Class bubbles will return.
- o Children's lunches will be served in their classroom
- Staggered playtimes for all class groups.

## VISITORS RISK ASSESSMENT



Contact with someone suffering from Coronavirus

Everyone will be asked not to come into school if they are experiencing coronavirus symptoms. If you are living with anyone who is positive for COVID we would prefer you not to come into school, however if you wish to discuss this further please give the school a call.

If a symptomatic person comes into school they will be sent home immediately or isolated until they can be picked up. 999 will be called if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk.

A deep clean will take place in the areas that the symptomatic person has been in, and PPE will be disposed of properly, following decontamination guidance.

If a visitor working with pupils or staff tests positive for coronavirus, the SLT will then trace and track to see who they have been in contact with and decide who / which classes / bubbles needs to self - isolate

If any pupil or staff member is confirmed to have Covid then SLT will complete an in school test and trace to identify who needs to self-isolate

All staff, pupils, visitors and contractors are encouraged to frequently wash their hands with soap and water for 20 seconds and dry thoroughly using NHS

School team to ensure all areas have resources at the start of each day



Spreading infection due to touch, sneezes and coughs

guidelines, or use alcoholbased hand sanitiser to cover all parts of their hands

Clean their hands-on arrival, before and after eating, and after sneezing or coughing

Be encouraged not to touch their mouth, eyes and nose

Use a tissue or elbow to cough or sneeze, and use bins for tissue waste

Supplies for soap, hand sanitiser and disposable paper towels and tissues will be topped up regularly and monitored to make sure they're not close to running out.

Where possible good ventilation of room – keep doors and windows open where possible



Visitors entering classrooms For lesson observations

During the visit, visitors should limit the number of personal belongings they bring into school and store them securely.

Visitors are requested to wear a face covering when on the school site.

Visitors should only use their own equipment (not sharing pens to sign documents etc.)

During an observation, visitors should seat themselves at the back of the classroom, maintain 2metres of distance where possible from children and other adults in the room. They should also not work closely alongside any children.

The visitor needs to adhere to all guidelines put in place by the school.
